The Humility of God

Philippians 2:5-11, Matthew 21:1-11 I read this recently, "Successful entrepreneurs put all of their efforts into building and growing their new ventures, setting their own egos aside" (John Rampton). Love, too, is like that, it puts its effort into the relationship with the one who is loved, setting aside its own importance. It could be said of Jesus that in putting all his efforts into inviting people to be part of God's realm, he set his own ego aside.

Embodying love, too, he gave no thought to his own standing or safety, he gave himself for the sake of those whom he loved. This complete absence of egotism is represented in his Palm Sunday ride into Jerusalem. Biblical scholars, Crossan and Borg, speculate that, at the same time as Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor, was entering from the other side of the city, accompanied by all the pomp and boastfulness of imperial Rome. Then the contrast is striking.

The one who reflects the very nature of God comes to Jerusalem, to Australia, to every one of us, in the humility born of love. It follows then that egotism, feelings of superiority and arrogant disregard of others should have no place in our lives. The way to prevent self-confidence turning into heartless egotism is to have a self-confidence based on Christ-confidence. When we listen to the Christ within, the Spirit of love, we forget self and give ourselves to living and sharing the reign of God. We care not for recognition or honours. We act out Christ's way of compassion.

Gratitude

Twice this week whilst meeting two of the regular walkers en route, each one of them mentioned how much we have to be grateful for. One commented we are fortunate that we have so much space and are able to keep safe distancing and that we have good governance - authorities that are showing leadership and support, financial and otherwise to anxious and troubled persons and households. This is indeed true, particularly if one were to compare it to my home country Zimbabwe or South Africa. In Zimbabwe good governance is questionable and there is no financial support; whilst in South Africa it is physically impossible to keep safe physical distances in townships where hundreds of thousands of persons live less than a meter apart from one another and households have to share common public ablution facilities. The second person also commented on the space and the beauty of our surroundings. Again, very true, compared to persons having to stay at home in cities and apartment blocks. Personally, I am blessed to know that ancient mammals such as platypus and pre-historic water dragons are playing in a pool 500m away from my front door. Yes, it has been proven time and time again that counting our blessings helps us through difficult times. As the old song encourages:

Count your blessings, name them one by one; Count your blessings, see what God hath done; Count your blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you what the Lord hath done.

Are you ever burdened with a load of care?

Does the cross seem heavy you are called to bear?

Count your many blessings, every doubt will fly,

And you will be singing as the days go by.

When you look at others with their lands and gold, Think that Christ has promised you His wealth untold.

Count your many blessings, money cannot buy Your reward in heaven, nor your Lord on high.

So amid the conflict, whether great or small, Do not be discouraged, God is over all; Count your many blessings, angels will attend, Help and comfort give you to your journey's end.

Gratitude is however, much more than counting our blessings. It is recognising our humanity, our own individuality, our own uniqueness and then realising the wondrous miracle: God - immortal, invisible, inaccessible became flesh, became finite, became human. It is to call out together with John (1 John 1 vs 1-4): "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched – this we proclaim concerning the Word of Life. ... We write this to make our joy complete."

Or, as stated by Diana Butler Bass (2018) "Gratitude is not about stuff. Gratitude is the emotional response to the surprise of our very existence, to sensing that inner light and realising the astonishing sacred, social, and scientific events that brought each of us into being. We cry out like the psalmist, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made!" (Ps 139 vs 14).
