WITNESS TO THE RESURRECTION

A witness speaks out of personal experience, not hearsay. A witness testifies not only by words, but by

body language and by actions as well. Without the appropriate demeanor, words fall flat. They sound hollow.

Since Christians are called to be witnesses of Christ's resurrection, how can we be effective witnesses? It's not enough to relay what others have told us or to simply repeat church doctrine. It's not a matter of theological or biblical knowledge. It has to come out of our own personal experience. But we haven't had the visual experience that Christ's followers had in the period soon after his death. However, that does not mean that we have not had an experience of Christ – alive, impacting our lives, challenging us, leading us and encouraging us.

How has Christ impacted your life? Called you to a conscious and deliberate commitment to live under his authority, influenced the direction your life has taken, involved you in service for God and for other people, expanded your vision to give you a bigger view of life than once you had, healed you, released you from a heavy burden? Let's not keep such experiences to ourselves.

Here is something to share from the heart with anyone willing to listen. But remember, we witness to the resurrection not only by what we say, but by the way we live, the attitudes we exhibit, the way we relate to others. Let's live the resurrection, not just believe in it. Let's be the Easter people, not just those who celebrate it, even if, at this time we celebrate it in isolation.

- How has Christ impacted your life?
- How can we be effective witnesses to Christ's resurrection?
- If our witness is not just repeating church teaching or quoting biblical passages, what is the relationship between doctrine and witness?
- How do Easter people live?

Pruning

"The father breaks off every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and He prunes every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will be clean and bear more fruit." (John 15:2).

It is pruning time. Speak to neighbours and friends and most persons are using this stay-home-time to prune their trees, shrubs and vines. Cutting out dead branches, cleaning up unwanted branches, trimming back the good branches, opening up space for sun and new growth, better growth. And that is why we prune, so the tree or vine can grow better, bear more fruit. This is the helpful image used by Jesus in John 15 when he says He is the true vine and we can only bear more fruit if we remain in Him. Perhaps, we should use this stay-home-time to reflect, to enter into conversation with our Father, the Gardener, to identify what branches need pruning, cutting back, cutting out. We tend to be self-centred, selfconcerned, self-righteous. Perhaps our priorities regarding our monies and retirement plans are selfcentred and not God-centred and need pruning; or perhaps our values have been skewed by the values of the modern world of entitlement and need trimming; or perhaps our relationships have been overly influenced by self-concern, and not Divine forgiveness and need opening up.

If you are like me, new to Maleny hesitant to prune, wondering what to cut and what to leave – we have the assurance that it is God, our Father, Himself who is the Gardner and does the pruning to enable us to grow more fruit. Moreover, Jesus says we are to remain in Him, to remain in His love, and this will ensure a harvest of much fruit, enduring fruit and so God will be glorified. Care – take care of yourselves and others.


Commit – commit the COVID-19 pandemic to prayer.
