Come and purify me.

### Scripture:            **Ezekiel 37:1-14; 2 Corinthians 3:1-6; 13-17**

**Notes:**            *Who is Lord and the Giver of Life* (renews, restores, refreshes, resurrects, rebirths, born again, new life)

### **2 Corinthians 3:1-6; 13-17**

**vs 3** The Holy Spirit is the *spirit of the living God* that

**vs 6** *gives life*.

**vs 17** *the Lord is the Spirit, and the Spirit is the Lord; and*

**vs 17-18** where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is *liberty* (emancipation, freedom)(cf **Isaiah 61:1-2**); which brings

**vs 18** transformation, transfiguration;

**vs 7-11, 18** ever-increasing glorious glory;

**vs 12** hope; by

**vs 12-16** lifting the veil from our minds (reason, rationale)

**vs 1-6** The Spirit of the Living Lord now writes His word of the new covenant, no longer on stone (or paper) but on the hearts of people, so that they become *living letters* of the *living God*, for all to see and read.

The Spirit of the Living God gives life to:

- *a believer* – transforms/renews thoughts, perspectives, convictions, behaviour, desires, etc so that they can be witnesses, serve and spread, faith, hope & love;
- *the church* – dramatically as on Pentecost and the church in Acts, and more ordinarily as the churches in Asia – Minor;
- *Jesus Christ*. The Holy Spirit is the **Spirit of Christ** in two ways.
  - (i) The Holy Spirit is
    - a. the gift that Christ gives us,
    - b. that spreads the salvation of Christ;
    - c. that glorifies Christ;
    - d. makes Christ alive in us

(John 14:15-26; 15:26-27; 16:7-15; Acts 1:1-4, 2:33)
  - (ii) the Holy Spirit is also the Spirit of Christ in the sense that it is the Spirit who descends upon and fulfils Christ and through Christ gives life. This is evident from the
    - a. *prophecies* about the Spirit (Isiah 11:2; 61:1-4)
    - b. at the *birth* of Christ when the Holy Spirit descends upon the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:35)
    - c. at the baptism of Christ when the Holy Spirit descends like a dove upon Christ (Luke 3:22);
    - d. fills Christ at *the beginning of His ministry* (Luke 4:1);
    - e. empowers Christ *during his ministry* (Luke 4:14, 18-19);
    - f. *at Christ's resurrection* he is declared Son of God, our Lord, through the Holy Spirit (Romans 1:3-4);
    - g. *ascended and seated at the right of God*, Christ receives the Holy Spirit and pours out the Holy Spirit as a gift to us (Acts 2:33).

### **Ezekiel 37:1-14**

Ezekiel 37:9; Genesis 2:7, John 20:22 ***naphach*: to breathe, to blow.**

Most profound, powerful, intimate verb. God *blowing/breathing* life, His life-breathe (*ruach*) into us.
