Why Look Elsewhere?

Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

What happened? In the part of the world where Christianity has been most widely accepted, people are searching here, there and everywhere for gurus, teachers, leaders and saviours, yet they do not recognize the one who has been acknowledged among them for centuries.

They take on other yokes; some are spiritual, some philosophical, some political; some are brash, others are low-keyed; some are strange, some are familiar; some are ancient, others novel. To take someone's yoke is to live under that person's influence, their ideas and attitudes. In the time of Jesus, to live under the tutelage of a rabbi was to live under that rabbi's yoke.

Jesus contrasted his yoke with that of others of his time. Compared with them, his yoke was easy, for central to his teaching was the offer of grace, acceptance and forgiveness. God is reaching out to us; we do not have to climb the dizzy heights of religious and moral rectitude to get to God. Jesus has opened up the way to live an authentic human life, and through his Spirit is walking beside us as a friend to help us. All it calls for is humble trust, and that's the obstacle.

We humans like to be in control. We would rather have the satisfaction of reaching our own goals instead of seeking God's goals. We would rather get to God through learning or through attaining some esoteric knowledge revealed only to a privileged few than to live by faith in the One whose life was so inextricably linked with the life of the Father that to know one is to know the other.

- How do people make the life of faith a burden?

COVID STAGE 3 REOPENING

We are in the process of considering the ways in which fellowship groups can be re-established under Stage 3. Meanwhile

- Holy Communion gathering (up to 75 at Maleny; 30 at Montville & Palmwoods Church buildings respectively) on the first Sunday of the month
- Small Groups in a home (up to 20 visitors + household)
- Pastoral visiting, Visiting one and other within QLD
- Funerals (up to 100 mourners) plus 2 officiates, Weddings (up to 100 people) plus the couple and the celebrant, subject to the capacity of the building

- Re-establish Hall hire for groups up to the capacity of the building.
- Visitors register to be completed and destroyed after 54 days.
- Safety and hygiene protocols to be followed

POST-COVID BRUC QUESTIONNAIRE

We have been pondering what we would look like as a church once the COVID pandemic is over. Liena and others have, over the past few months, invited you to ponder this issue. It is also the primary topic addressed in the latest **New Vine**. We have discovered there are more ways of being church and doing church. And it may not necessarily mean that we simply go back to the "old". Rev Bruce Johnson has profoundly remarked that we profess the resurrection and not merely resuscitation, and invited us to consider what this means to us as BRUC.

A small group, at the initiation of Liena and with the knowledge of Council, under the chair of Rev Bruce Johnson, is exploring this further.
