September: Harvest Festival

We are going to be celebrating September as *Harvest Festival* month when we celebrate the gathering of harvest and focus on the joy of harvesting, the enjoyment of nature and commemoration of our own stewardship. For several years now, in the Uniting Church and other denominations it has been practice to celebrate the season of creation during September, so we are joining this tradition (see https://seasonofcreation.com/).

We are starting the series this Sunday with the wellknown text of John 15, where Jesus says: "I am the true vine, my Father is the gardener, and you are the branches". Emphasis will be on the command: "remain in me, and I will remain in you" – highlighting that "remain" is NOT a passive verb, but an *active* verb in the *present* tense.

And we bear fruit for the purposes of:

- Christ's joy and our joy;
- God's glory
- God's generosity

September 6: Forest Sunday and our texts will be Genesis 2:4b-25; Psalm 96, Revelation 22:1-5; September 13: Land Sunday and our texts will be Genesis 3:8-24; Leviticus 25:8-24; Revelation 21:1-8;

September 20: Wilderness/Outback Sunday: and the texts will be Joel 1:1-29 and Mark 1:1-15;

September 27: River Sunday and our text will be Gen 8:1, 15-22, 9:8-17 and Revelation 22: 1-5

October 4[:] **Harvest Sunday** is the grand celebration of harvesting. Out texts will be Deuteronomy 26 and Luke 3: 1-22

BRUC COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

Integrity

Romans 12:9-21; Matthew 16:21-28

Counterfeit bank notes have no value in the eyes of the law: fake love has no value in genuine relationships. While the passing of counterfeit bank notes is rare in our country, attempts to pass counterfeit love are all too common. So, just as everyone needs to be alert to the possibility of being landed with a fake fifty-dollar bill, we all need to beware of those who profess love but are not sincere. But what is more important than that is that we take note of Paul's injunction in Romans 12:9, to make sure that our own love is genuine.

Whether it be our love for God or for other people, make sure it is sincere, that it goes beyond mere words, that it is given without expecting something back in return. In the Letter to the Romans, Paul elaborates for his readers what that means, but one thing we can say about genuine love is that it is always costly. It involves time and effort, the surrender of our selfishness, concern for the wellbeing of the other.

The cross stands before us as a constant reminder of God's deep, sacrificial love for us all, and Jesus calls his disciples of every time and place to take up their own cross in following him (Matthew16:24). What gain is there if we should win the whole world but lose our soul's integrity?

Each Ministry location representative reported on the impact of COVID on the gradual return to usual activity. We heard some good stories about what's happening in the Reflections Gallery and the Community Garden together with the return of Ministry Task Groups and developments in the Visioning Group that have been meeting to discuss future directions.

A proposal for Ministry Task Groups and the report from the Visioning Group will be discussed at the upcoming AGM.

Rev Liena has been quite active too. Liena reported on ministry location meetings at Montville and Palmwoods; the pastoral work; continuation of online services; Presbytery weekly e- meetings etc.

Peter Callaghan is the COVID Warden and also attends a weekly zoom meeting of congregational representatives to ensure we are up-to-date with the latest advices and plans.

Finance matters were discussed. JobKeeper wage subsidies have been in place since March and will conclude at the end of September this year. The subsidy has eased pressure on the congregation's financial situation and we are thankful to God for this provision and another provision we are expecting to be finalised in the coming months.

Douglas McGubbin has been our voluntary, financial Auditor for many years. This year, Doug has resigned effective from 2021. The Council is very appreciative of Douglas's years of service to the BRUC.

The outgoing Chair thanks council members for their wisdom, dedication and commitment to the Blackall Range congregation and our communities.
