A Word to the Wise

Can a person be too wise? If it means being a bit of a smart Alec, yes, they can. But wisdom really has to do with insight about how one should live. It involves making sound judgments.

In the Bible, people are called to be wise because all true wisdom is of God. Wise people seek to live the way God wants them to live even though this way may not be self-evident to everyone. Wise people live as though Christ rules now although, as we say, its only at the end of the day that we see things as they really are. Wise people are inspired by the Spirit of God although they may not always be conscious of its origin. This is brought out by Jesus in his parable about the bridesmaids – five wise, but five foolish. The wise girls are those who were ready for the wedding where the wedding stands for the joyful occasion when God's reign is complete and acknowledged by all. The silly or foolish girls were caught unprepared.

We often think that wisdom comes from the past with age and experience, however true wisdom comes from the future – the future with God.
