Stewards of the Gospel

Matthew 25:14-30

You have been left a million dollars by your rich uncle, now what are you going to do with it? Splurge out on a lavish life-style, or invest it with the intention of becoming even richer? Give it all away to good and worthy causes, or set up a foundation to keep on supporting those good causes for many years to come? Maybe clear your mortgage and then give some away?

Jesus put a question like that to the high priests and Pharisees. In this parable, he virtually said to them, "You have been given the Law and the Prophets, the Temple and the Covenant, but you have blown it. You have hugged all this to yourselves. You have not used this gift to the glory of God and the well-being of the people.

Christ puts a similar question to us: "You have been given the Gospel; what have you done with it?" Have we wrapped it up and buried it in our backyard, not willing to risk it out in the hurly-burly of everyday life? Or have we invested it in daily life, lived it out amid the complexities of life, shared it with others and rejoiced in the way that it changes lives and communities? Have we played safe or have we risked living the way of Jesus?

- How would you spend a million-dollar windfall?
- What does this parable have to say about stewardship?
- How do you react to the thought that you are a steward of the Gospel?
- What risks do we run when we invest the Gospel in our daily living?

The fear of difference

"There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28)

I read recently that much of political rhetoric drives our fear of difference; and the inverse is also true: our fear of difference fuels the political rhetoric. But this is not only a reality in the political sphere, but also in our personal, social and faith spheres.

One of humankind's basic needs is to be accepted. To belong. Look at any teenager (and most persons), who will go to great lengths to be accepted.

And because we long to be accepted, we long to be the same. We feel safe and secure in the group. In what we call "normal". And then the normal becomes the tradition and the truth.

We fear persons who are different to us. We fear persons of another colour or creed, or gender or sexual orientation. We fear they will change us, change our values, change our beliefs. We feel safe, secure with persons who think like me, speak like me and believe like me. And soon our way of thinking, speaking and believing becomes the "norm" and the truth.

The reality is that the world is diverse. The community, the church, the local congregation are places of diversity. Persons who think differently, speak differently, worship differently and yes, even believe differently. Persons interrupt the Bible differently, have different images of God.

So how do we respond? The answer is multifold and complex. Yet, I belief there are several guiding principles: one is *unity* and another *love*. We need to take our unity in Christ seriously. It is a critical part of our identity. It was Christ's fervent prayer at the eve of His crucifixion. Unity, or inversely, dissent and fear of persons of different culture, creed, class, colour and gender were the issues the early church struggled with. Things do not seem to have changed much the past few millennium!

And the Word teaches us that God is love and that there is no fear in love. Indeed, love drives all fear out.

"God is love, and those who live in love live in union with God and God lives in union with them. There is no fear in love; perfect loves drives out all fear." (1 John 4)
