*****LECTIONARY THEMES*****

What Kind of Messiah?

Mark 1:14-20:

Whether it be the child's eagerly awaited birthday party, the pregnant mother's birthing expectations, or a carefully planned major holiday, there comes a time when the period of waiting is ended and anticipation turns into lived experience. When the time arrives, it may live up to expectations or be a great disappointment. It may exceed expectations.

All four gospel writers tell us that the life, death and resurrection of Jesus was the fulfilment of Israelite expectations about a coming Messiah. "The kingdom of God has come near," they said. However, for many of his fellow citizens, he was so different from what they expected that they could not identify him as such. They still await the coming of the Messiah. That's not surprising. Instead of ruling with political, military, and economic power, his rule was an expression of love – self-giving, compassionate, holy love. Instead of being for Israel alone, it was for all people.

For those who could see it, it exceeded all expectations. It called for a complete change of approach. Hence the call to repent and believe. It involves the dethronement of our ego and our cooperation with the Spirit of Christ dwelling within us.

Could this be the message for Australia on Australia Day? National greatness does not come from finding a political, military, and economic messiah, but from allowing Christ to have his way in national, community, family, and personal life.

- Recall times when your periods of expectation come to fruition. Were your expectations realized or exceeded, or were you disappointed?
- ➤ If Jesus was so different from the Messiah generally expected in his day, why claim for him the title of Messiah?
- ➤ Why is it necessary to repent and believe to become part of the kingdom of God?
- ➤ What makes a nation truly great?

Titus 1:1-3; 2:11-3:8

God the Philanthropist

Our message today is from Titus and I encourage you to read this remarkable, yet oft neglected letter of Paul to his young Greek fellow worker and partner, often described as an emissary – representative and messenger. Paul himself refers to Titus as "zealous" and "enthusiastic" (Reference to Titus can also be found in Gal 2:1-3; 2 Cor 7:5-7; 8:6, 8:16-24).

We are in the time of Epiphany – God's appearance and revelation to us. It is the time on the church calendar between Christmas and Lent – so a special time during which we reflect upon how God appears to us and in Titus 3:4 God is described as the *phil-anthropist* meaning lover of humankind.

And Titus 3 vs 5 speaks of baptism as the 'washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit". So we will also recall our baptism and the meaning thereof for our daily lives.

Here then, is an adapted modern prayer on baptism, from a modern liturgical site

Baptismal Prayer

Lord, thank you for the precious gift of baptism, that we can publicly declare our love and passion for you. Lord, we ask for your goodness and blessings to be poured out on us. We pray that you would work deeply within our hearts and souls to renew and refresh them each day. Come guide our footsteps, give them a hope and a vision for the future. Today, the past is gone. We stand free and whole, loved and forgiven within the kingdom of God. Father, cover and protect us now, encircle us with your promises and
