LECTIONARY THEMES

February 28 Hope Based on Faith

Romans 4:13-25; Mark 8:31-38.

Along with the rest of the world, we in Australia are, at this time, placing our faith in Pfizer/BioNTech and Oxford/AstraZeneca to beat the covid pandemic. This faith enables us to look forward to a time beyond the threats and restrictions that we have had to live under for the last twelve months.

Faith gives us confidence to look forward to what is to come. It was faith that enabled Abraham to continue to look forward to the realization of God's promise when everything seemed set against it – the promise that he should be the father of a great nation.

Faith in God who spoke to the world in Jesus and raised him from the dead is the basis on which we look forward to what is to come. Through faith in Christ, we look forward to lives lived in joyful union with God in this life and beyond. As impossible as it seems, we look forward to humanity being freed from the shackles of evil and living by the light of God's love or, in other words, living in the kingdom of God.

By faith in God, we dare now to live the life of God's future realm – a realm of peace, justice, integrity and goodness. By faith in God, we live now as people who are forgiven and reconciled to God, called and committed.

- Can you think of occasions when your hope grew out of faith? EG: your hope for a safe arrival at the end of a journey was based on your faith in the driver.
- What does Romans 4:23-24 have to say about the relationship between grace and faith?

- What hopes do you have on the basis of your faith in Christ?
- Mark 8:31-38 indicates that living this life of faith and hope is not easy. What in this passage strikes you most forcefully?



Mark 8 vs 27-38. His Love is deeper still

Lord, I rejoice that nothing can come between me and your love,
Even when I feel alone
or in difficulty,
When in sickness or am troubled.
Even if attacked or afraid,
"no abyss of mine is so deep
That Your love is not deeper
still."

Self-denial: "Forget self, take up your cross, and follow me". Jesus' call to self-denial is not, as sometimes, interpreted a call to be a doormat, to be the least or to hate oneself. Jesus was nobody's doormat – indeed He boldly spoke out against injustice and the powerful, He compassionately reached out to the marginalised and weak.

It is a call to choose, constantly and consistently, the way of love; of siding with the marginalised and miserable, it is a way of empathy. It means to follow in the footsteps of the one who said "Love your enemies. Forgive one another."

This may not always be an easy road. Some will call you: a traitor, others a fool, others mad. Some even "crucify him/her".

Choice But is does ask of us a choice. And that choice is only fully understood in the face of the Father's love. For, whoever chooses me and the gospel will save their lives and see the glory of the Father.

Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture

The Uniting Church wholeheartedly and publicly commits to being a child safe organisation. This commitment influences our decision-making and guides our practice. Our leaders and our volunteers commit to safe church principles by completing and signing a Statement of Personal Commitment: "I will put the safety and well-being of children and vulnerable people first, and I will encourage others to do the same." We document the standards of behaviour we expect from leaders, staff and volunteers as shared guardians responsible for the safety of children and vulnerable adults in contact with the Church. All volunteers are required to sign a Statement of Personal Commitment each year.

The Statement of Commitment is attached electronically or can be collected from the Church office and should be completed for the next Blackall Range Church Council meeting.

Maleny Ministry Task Group

The Church Council met on February 15 and tried to discern the way forward for this year. In the wake of the disruptions of last year and the uncertainties we face ahead this is not easy.

During 2019 we tried to introduce a new structure for the Blackall Range Churches. We have one Church Council to provide overall leadership to all three communities. There was also supposed to be a Ministry Task Group in each location. In Palmwoods and Montville this has worked well since their smaller numbers mean that as they sit around after worship, the whole congregation can discuss local issues and suggest ways forward. This hasn't worked so well in Maleny, since depending on when meetings are called, different people attend and offer insights, but there is no consistent direction. Also in the past 12 months even those meetings could not happen.

Therefore the Church Council has asked Maleny to choose a small group of leaders who can discuss local issues and discern ways forward. We suggest a group of 6 people, some who have been around a while and some who are newer to the family. They will meet regularly with Liena and guide the way ahead.

We would like you to think and pray about this and nominate suitable folk by the 5th of March. Then on March 21 we will hold a meeting here after worship to choose a team of six people to help lead us forward. There are forms available for nomination and I would encourage you to take one and think about those people you feel would be helpful in leading us forward. The forms can be given to Bruce Johnson or Liena or left in the office before March 5th. We will announce the nominations on Sunday 7th and again on the 14th March before we are asked to choose on March 21.
