LECTIONARY THEMES

Humility and Pride

Isaiah 50:4-9a; Philippians 2:5-11; Mark 11:1-10;

The world in which we live is saying to us, "Walk tall. Take pride in yourself. Be proud of your ethnicity or sexuality. Be proud of your accomplishments." How then does this ride with the Biblical emphasis on humility? The Son of God comes in humility, to serve, not to be served. He gives his life a ransom for many. He rides into Jerusalem to claim his royal status, but not in the fullness of pride, pomp, and prestige that ruling elites usually claim for themselves. An early Christian poem, quoted by Paul, described him as one who, in humility, emptied himself of all that sort of thing.

Humility for Jesus did not mean giving in to others. He knew his calling and he resolutely stuck to it in spite of temptations to deviate from it. His humility was anything but weak and powerless. His humility was not something to be aimed at for itself; it was a by-product of his devotion to the Father; and so the humility that we are called to is not a goal to be aimed at, but rather something that follows on from truly loving God with all our being. When the centre of our lives shifts from self to God, we lose self-centred pride and arrogance. Sometimes, however, we have to remind ourselves of this by deliberately taking the humble path.

The world is right; we are not called to become snivelling weaklings, despising ourselves or living in continual self-abasement. We are God's beloved creatures, not meant, out of self-centred pride, to usurp God's central position in life.

- Give examples, drawn from TV, other media or from conversations you have had, where pride was being encouraged.
- In what way did the Palm Sunday ride of Jesus into Jerusalem highlight the humility of Jesus?

- Think of a time when you deliberately took the humble path as an expression of your Christian faith
- In the light of Jesus' example, what is the difference between what might be called strong humility and weak humility?

Holy Week: The Journey from Palm Sunday to Resurrection Sunday

Although it is not practically possible to precisely plot Jesus' journey shortly before His death, the church has over centuries commemorated Holy Week and constructed this time-line to assist us in reflecting upon Jesus' Easter journey and so help us to enrich our own faith.

Day 1: Palm Sunday: Triumphant entry into Jerusalem

(Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44, and John 12:12-19).

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus, the Servant-King, entering Jerusalem on a donkey (contrary to a horse which Kings would have ridden in those times), with the crowds throwing down palm leaves and clothes and singing:

Zechariah 9:9

"Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!".

Jesus and the disciples spent the night in Bethany (probably at the home of Lazarus, Martha & Mary).

Note: Palm branches are a symbol of victory, triumph and peace. And for some eternal life.

Day 2: Monday: Jesus cleanses the temple

(Matthew 21:12–22, Mark 11:15–19, Luke 19:45-48, and John 2:13-17)"The Scriptures declare, 'My Temple will be a house of prayer,' but you have turned it into a den of thieves" (Luke 19:46).

Jesus and the disciples probably spend the night again in Bethany.

Day 3: Tuesday: Jesus goes to the Mount of Olives

(Matthew 21:23–24:51, Mark 11:20–13:37, Luke 20:1–21:36, and John 12:20–38)

Jesus and the disciples go to the Mount of Olives (Mt 24:3) and He gave what is known as the Olivet Discourse and He teaches about the end times through parable and signs.

Tuesday is probably also the day on which Judas Iscariot discussed betraying Jesus with the Sanhedrin.

Day 4: Wednesday: Holy Wednesday

There is no clear indication what Jesus did on the Wednesday. Probable reconstruction is that Jesus and the disciples had a quiet day in Bethany preparing for the coming Passover;

Day 5: Maundy Thursday; Passover and Last Supper

(Matthew 26:17–75, Mark 14:12-72, Luke 22:7-62, and John 13:1-38).

"I have been very eager to eat this Passover meal with you before my suffering begins. For I tell you

now that I won't eat this meal again until its meaning is fulfilled in the Kingdom of God." (Luke 22:15-16).

Jesus shares the Last Supper in the Upper Room with His disciples and close followers, washes their feet, and later goes to the garden of Gethsemane to pray.

It is here that he is betrayed by Judas and arrested by the Sanhedrin and taken to the High Priest.

Also late Thursday night/early Friday morning that Peter denies knowing Jesus.

Note: Maundy comes from the Latin word "mandatum" whence the English words "mandate" and command are derived. It refers to Jesus command to His disciples to do likewise (love and serve).

Day 6: Good Friday: Trial, Crucifixion, Death and Burial

(Matthew 27:1-62, Mark 15:1-47, Luke 22:63-23:56, and John 18:28-19:37)

Jesus trials continue before different authorities until Pilate orders him to be crucified and Jesus dies on the cross at approx. 3pm and is later taken down by Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus (members of the Sanhedrin) to be buried before 6pm.

Day 7: Saturday in the tomb:

(Matthew 27:62-66, Mark 16:1, Luke 23:56, and John 19:40)

From the readings of the texts it appears that Jesus' body was partly treated with spices by Joseph and Nicodemus on the Friday evening before the Sabbath started at 6pm, whist the women prepared more spices to treat it after the Sabbath (6pm on the Saturday i.e. early Sunday morning).

Day 8: Resurrection Sunday

(Matthew 28:1-13, Mark 16:1-14, Luke 24:1-49, and John 20:1-23).

The culmination of Holy Week and the foundation of the Christian faith: Jesus' resurrection!

Don't be afraid! I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He isn't here! He is risen from the dead, just as he said would happen." (Matthew 28:5-6)

Consequent to and since that first Easter Sunday, Jesus' resurrection is celebrated every Sunday of each year by millions of Christians.

The Lord is risen. He is risen indeed!!!


