## **Ron Potter and Piula Publications**

Rev Ron Potter has a remarkable ministry of art and literature. For many decades Ron has written reflections, almost weekly, of scripture passages, generally following the cycle of the Revised Common Lectionary. These have been published under *piulapublications.com*. *Piula* is the Samoan word for Beulah, referring to Isaiah 62 vs 4 where the promise of Israel being called Beulah — meaning a happy marriage between God and His people through the bridal metaphor. *Piula* is a name borrowed by Ron

whilst he and Ruth were in ministry in Samoa for a time (late sixties)(Note: Piula Theological College, Samoa now have their own website and Piula Publications).

Persons and groups within Maleny, and later BRUC have benefited from and been blessed by Ron's reflections. And for this particular ministry we give thanks!

This week will be Ron's last contemporary contribution. However, the wonder of the written word is that: "Words, once they are written, have a life of their own." (Carol Burnett). So, with Ron's permission we will delve into the archives and continue with these valued reflections.

## \*\*\*LECTIONARY THEMES\*\*\*

## The Work of God's Spirit in Human Experience

John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15

This year, Pentecost and Wesley Day are only one day apart. This might encourage us to focus on the close link between the Holy Spirit's work in our lives and John Wesley's emphasis on experiential religion. On the 24<sup>th</sup> May 1738, the Rev. John Wesley, Fellow of Lincoln College, Oxford, went to a Moravian meeting in Aldersgate Street, London, and there, during a reading from Luther's *Preface to the Epistle to Romans*, felt his heart strangely warmed and felt that he did trust in Christ, Christ alone for his salvation and, "An assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.'

So, we have this emphasis present in the heritage of the Uniting Church that our relationship with God through Christ is more than a theoretical dogma; it is, by the action of God's Spirit in our lives, a lived experience. Not that we are saved by the experience itself, but

the action of the Holy Spirit effects a change in us, a confidence in God's love and salvation, and joy in following him.

The foundations for our faith lie in the Bible, in Church tradition, in reason and in personal experience. When we feel that God is speaking to us through any one of these it is wise to see how that word is confirmed or otherwise via these other channels as well.

- How have you experienced the work of the Holy Spirit in your life?
- Do you experience the Holy Spirit as a 'friend at court' as John 15 and 16 suggest?
- Why is it Important that God's Word spoken through one of the four ways listed above should be validated by the others?
- How is the activity of the Holy Spirit in the Church manifest today?
