LECTIONARY THEMES

Sheep Without a Shepherd

Ephesians 2:11-22 Mark 6:30-34, 53-56

In these two readings, the words that stand out for me right now are, "As he went ashore, he (Jesus) saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd" (Mark 6:34) and, in Ephesians, the reference to the Gentile Christians once being, "Aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world".

These passages apply to many people today who are searching for a spirituality, hungry for a deep and satisfying relationship with the Infinite, confused by beckoning isms and gurus, empty of meaning and ultimate purpose for their lives, aware that something is missing but they do not know what it is.

The Spirit of Christ still looks with compassion on such people. Whether they give some allegiance to the Judeo-Christian tradition or whether they search around through an assortment of other traditions, we see people floundering, lost and bewildered.

They haven't realized that with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus a new possibility opened up, a different way of living life. They don't understand that Jesus offers the vision of a world re-made after God's own heart. They don't live within the experience of God's love and grace. They don't rejoice in God's forgiveness and acceptance.

They are restless because they are not in a trusting relationship with God. They cannot recognize God's presence and activity in the world around them nor in their own hearts and lives; nor in the people that they meet day by day.

They don't realize it, but, while they may reject or ignore God, they have chosen substitute gods like money and possessions, feelings, pleasure, power, popularity, maybe nationalism, patriotism, sport or just plain selfishness, yet, deep down, they know that these do not satisfy.

Compassion will not allow us to shrug our shoulders and keep the Jesus-message to ourselves.

- What signs do you see of a spiritual restlessness in people today?
- Where are people looking in their restless search for spirituality?
- Why don't they accept Christ's offer to be their shepherd and guide?
- What did Jesus mean when he said that the people were like sheep without a shepherd?
