RCL Year B Readings

Esther 7:1-6,9-10;9:20-22; Psalm 124 James 5:13-20; Mark 9:38-50

Psalm 1 vs 1-3

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, ² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night. ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers.

*****LECTIONARY THEMES*****

IN MY NAME

James 3:13-4:3,7-8a Mark 9:30-37

When a person acts in the name of another it means acting on behalf of that person and with that person's authorisation, or it could refer to representing a company, a government or an organisation. It involves keeping true to the intention of the one that is represented.

When Jesus talks about praying or doing things in his name he is talking about acting in a way that is consistent with his teaching and his way of life. Just as Jesus spoke and acted in the name of God, he invites his followers to speak and act in his name.

When we pray in Jesus' name we are saying that this prayer echoes the mind and spirit of Jesus or we ask that God answers that prayer in so far as it reflects the teaching and attitude of Jesus.

One day Jesus put his arm around a small child amid the gathering of his disciples and said, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me." In the society in which Jesus lived, the child was regarded as lowly in status and standing. He seems then to be speaking about welcoming the least and the lowly. As he reached out to the outcasts of his society so his followers are to reach out and welcome those whom society despises.

As James indicates, God-inspired wisdom is very different from worldly wisdom. Jesus as Messiah is very different from what people generally think of in a Messiah. To accept Jesus as one's own Saviour and Lord is to seek always to represent him and his way of life in the world. Then, one thing that this will mean is welcoming the least and the lowly. It means having an open and welcoming attitude toward outcasts in our society, especially welcoming them into the life of the Church.
