# Release from Bondage

Isaiah 61:1-4,8-11.

We long for peace and happiness, but have you noticed that it is the times of defeat and sadness that shape our lives most profoundly. Bushfires, Gallipoli, cyclones, droughts, world wars, economic depression - these have shaped our Australian selfunderstanding rather than the safe and easy times. So it was for ancient Israel. It was the experience of slavery in Egypt and exile in Babylon that stood out most clearly in their collective memory. These were times when they were aware of God's saving grace most keenly for out of these situations God rescued them.

Then the rejection and crucifixion of Jesus is sometimes represented as another Exodus or Release from Captivity. In his preaching on Isaiah 61 in the Nazareth synagogue, Jesus described his ministry as release from Babylonian exile. In using this comparison, Jesus implied that the human race is in captivity to Satan, but his great announcement was that through him God was bringing deliverance to all.

Why continue to live in bondage then when we have been set free? Why plod along under the load of our sinfulness when we have been redeemed? Why continue with violence and greed when the way of peace and justice is opened up for us? And as the spirit of the Lord is upon us, we are sent to bring the good news about salvation to all who struggle under the burden of obligations, political and economic oppression, addictions to self-serving interests and to pleasure, imprisonment by their own habits and cultural mores. The Lord who loves justice and hates robbery and wrongdoing calls us to model in our daily lives the Gospel that we preach.

- Is it true in your own experience that it is the times of defeat and sadness that have shaped your life most profoundly?
- Great writing, like that in Isaiah 61, while coming out of a particular situation, release of the Israelites from captivity in Babylon, can be relevant to other situations as well. Can you think of other writings that, while written out of a particular situation can be applied more generally?
- This passage is all about deliverance. From what has God delivered you? From what does our community need to be delivered?
- How are you modelling the Gospel in your daily life?
