The Way of Submission

Luke 1:26-38

Submission, that's a hated word! We hear of people being beaten into submission. It suggests servile, humiliating defeat. It implies weakness. It reeks of insincerity when we see people using apparent submission as a ruse to get what they want. But Mary's words of submission in Matthew 1:38 have been highly extolled throughout the years. She is pointed to as a model for us to follow for she was submissive to the will and word of God, ready to serve God's purposes in whatever way it was asked of her, irrespective of the cost.

Voluntary submission to the will and word of God lies at the heart of Christian discipleship. We are called to place ourselves in the hands of God, ready for service. This is powerfully voiced in John Wesley's Covenant Prayer which he encouraged his followers to pray at the beginning of each new year.

"I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."
