ASYLUM SEEKERS NEEDING ACCOMMODATION – URGENT CALL

Asylum seekers are in tremendously vulnerable situations, with no work rights, no access to Medicare, or Social Security benefits, or public housing. Brisbane Refugee and Asylum Seeker Support Network (BRASS) and Community are seeking the help of the churches.

An appeal to Congregations. You can help by:

- Assisting to find 3-4+ bedroom properties that could be provided for low rent. BRASS will put professional tenancy support and property management in place to support residents and property owners – using approaches we have learned over 10+ years.
- Rallying volunteers to support people from asylum seeker backgrounds in various ways
