I am sure you have noticed the seasonal changes a rural landscape can offer. At planting time, the ground is prepared, and the seed is planted. The plants will be tended with care and soil nourishment considered. Then, with the right weather conditions comes the miracle of growth and, ultimately, the often-feverish activity of harvest. Better Together Housing (BTH) is an innovative program, co-created by two leading charities on the Sunshine Coast in partnership with women in the community.

Its primary purpose is to address the rising cost of living and the risk of social isolation facing single women over 55 years old living alone.

Participants can be women who own or rent their home but are interested in finding a woman to share with, or women who are looking for a new place to

live with one (or more) other woman. We also welcome women who are not sure about sharing, but want to connect with other women and explore a little first before deciding.

We are different to regular flatmate finder platforms, we are specifically for older women, and every registered participant has undertaken a police check so you can feel secure.

Better Together Housing is an inclusive community and welcomes women over 55 to respectfully participate regardless of where they have come from, their religion, their culture or their sexuality.
