Reconciliation and NAIDOC week

The path of reconciliation is a complex journey that often involves navigating disappointment and challenges. This was especially evident in the wake of a divisive referendum, where hopes were high, but outcomes fell short; it was natural for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and our allies to feel a sense of disillusionment and frustration. However, it is during these moments of disappointment that the seeds of change are often sown.

Each year, National Reconciliation Week (27 May – 3 June) serves as a fundamental opportunity for reflection, dialogue and healing. We use this time to acknowledge past wrongs, confront uncomfortable truths, and work towards building a more inclusive and equitable society. We encourage this as a time to listen and to learn, and we saw that occur across UnitingCare, the Uniting Church and all Uniting agencies across the nation.

As we moved through National Reconciliation Week this year, the theme of "Now More Than Ever" resonated deeply for mob and certainly for our Elders. It reminded us that while the work of reconciliation is ongoing, that now, more than ever, our voices must rise in order to be heard as we recommit ourselves to creating change with a sense of renewed hope.

Looking ahead to NAIDOC Week, with the theme of "Keep The Fire Burning," we are reminded of the strength and vitality of First Nations cultures being passed down through generations and generations. The flame is our connection to the land, to each other and to the rich tapestry of traditions that define us as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. As we honour this flame, we honour our Elders, our old people and our Ancestors. We honour who we are as a peoples, we stand in our strength and continue to build a renewed and fortified path of reconciliation.
